

Selection and care of play materials

- Safe ,washable, light weight ,simple ,durable ,easy to handle and non breaking .
- Realistic ,attractive, constructive and offer problem solving opportunities.
- No sharp edges and no small removable parts which may be swallowed or inhaled
- Not over stimulating and frustrating
- No toxic paints ,not costly ,not inflammable and not excessive noisy
- Play things with electrical plugs should be avoided.

Child-education

- Correct use of toys
- Safe storing of toys –away from busy areas
- Keeping the things in good things
- Selection of appropriate toys
- Use of electronic toys



Suitable play materials

Infants 4 weeks to 4 months	Bright and moving objects ,hanging cradle toys ,musical toys ,ballons, rattles
4 to 6 months	Soft squeeze toys ,rattles,toy animals ,ballons etc
7 to 9 months	Squeeze and sound toys ,blocks ,cubes, plastic ring,rattles etc
10 to 12 months	Motions toys, water play, blocks, doll, ball, musical toys, picture books or stiff cards, rocking horse walker, transporting objects, pull and pusjh toys

Toddler	Informal free spontaneous, constructive parallel play, fitting toys, pull push toys, blocks, ball, doll, pots and pans
Preschool	Cooperative, imitative, creative and imaginative puppets, animals, dolls animal houses, carpentry tools
Schooler	Competetive formal organized and cooperative play Painting materials ,chess ,gardening ,cards ,balls, games of running ,climbing ,puzzles.

Levels of observation

Level 1-observe exactly what the child does

Level 2- observes and records child's feelings about the activity

Level 3 –observers impression and interpretations of observed

behaviour
