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### STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE PEER ASSISTED LEARNING (PAL) PROGRAM

### Purpose:

To enhance the educational experience and foster student collaborative learning through peer-assisted teaching and mentorship.

### Scope:

This procedure applies to all 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year BSc and P.B.B.Sc nursing students acting as peer educators, and 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>-semester students receiving mentorship at Holy Spirit Institute of Nursing Education.

### **Objectives:**

- 2. **Promote active learning:** Engage both peer educators and learners in active participation, improving retention and application of knowledge.
- 3. **Develop communication skills:** Refine communication and teaching abilities of peer educators, while building learners' confidence in articulating their understanding.
- 4. Foster collaboration: Encourage teamwork and create a supportive learning community within the institute.

### Procedures:

### 1. Program Setup

### 1.1 Selection of Peer Educators:

- Identify advanced learners of 3rd and 4th year BSc and P.B.B.Sc nursing students.
- Ensure selected students exhibit strong academic performance and communication skills.

### 1.2 Assignment of Programme Coordinator:

- Bind the peer educators with the learners with the help of class coordinators.
- Ensure each mentor has a manageable number of lectures to be conducted, to provide effective support.

### 2. Training and Orientation

### 2.1 Orientation Session:

- Conduct an initial orientation session for peer educators.
- Outline the objectives, responsibilities, and benefits of the program.

### 2.2 Training Workshops:

- Provide training workshops on effective teaching methods, communication skills, and peer mentorship techniques.
- Lesson plans are prepared by the peer educators and approved by the Principal.

### 3. Implementation of PAL Sessions

### 3.1 Scheduling:

- Establish a regular schedule for PAL sessions.
- •Ensure sessions do not conflict with theory regular classes and other academic commitments for the educators. They are assigned classes during their end-of-the-posting clinical hours

### 3.2 Content Coverage:

- Focus on subjects such as Fundamentals of Nursing, Anatomy and Physiology, Nutrition and Dietetics, and Psychology.
- Tailor sessions to address the specific needs of learners.

### 3.3 Buddy Teaching:

- Implement buddy teaching methods where peer educators assist learners in revising material and simplifying complex concepts.
- 4. Monitoring and Evaluation

### PRACTICE:

The Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) program at Holy Spirit Institute of Nursing Education is designed to facilitate collaborative learning experiences among students. Specifically, 3rd,4th year BSc and P.B.B.Sc nursing students take on the role of educators, guiding and supporting 1st and 2nd-semester students in various subjects including Fundamentals of Nursing, Anatomy, and Physiology, Nutrition, and Dietetics, Psychology, among others.

In addition to traditional teaching methods, PAL participants engage in buddy teaching, offering support in revising material and simplifying concepts to facilitate understanding for their peers. These advanced learners not only fulfill their academic requirements but also take on the role of mentors for junior students.

The PAL program stands out for its innovative approach to learning, where students take on dual roles as both learners and educators. This reciprocal teaching model not only benefits the students receiving instruction but also empowers peer educators to reinforce their own understanding of the material through teaching. Emotional Intelligence: Participants gained insights into emotional intelligence and its role in understanding and managing emotions effectively.




